Student Responsibilities

Homework

Homework may be assigned or work may be sent home because it is not completed during the allotted time. Each night the students will be expected to read nightly.

We encourage you to look over your child's work and assist them as needed. Most concepts are discussed in school on that day, so there should be minimal confusion. Please notify your child's teacher if your child is struggling with a concept. Homework should not be stressful!

Planners

This will be your child's first year using the upper grade school planner. As this is a new responsibility, we will spend ample amount of time at the beginning of the school year getting into the routine. They will be responsible for filling out the planner and gathering the necessary materials to complete each assignment. They will also be responsible for keeping their planner safe. Replacement planners are \$10.00. Please take a moment to look at the planner and sign the corresponding page every day! The planner is another mode of communication between teacher and parent as well. You may make notes in the planner if needed, as we will do the same.

Restroom:

Students may use the restroom before school, at recess or lunch, and after school. Students will not be allowed to use the restroom during instructional time unless it is an emergency. (If your child has a medical condition, please let your child's teacher know.)

Water Policy:

Students will not be allowed to leave the class to get a drink of water. Students will be allowed to bring in a water bottle to

leave at their desk. Please do not fill your child's bottle with anything other than water.

Snacks:

Students will be allowed to bring a snack to eat at recess. There will be no eating of snacks in the class during class times. If possible, please make sure that your child brings a healthy snack to class. It will be asked of the students not to share their snacks with other classmates (due to any allergies of the other students). Please do not send your child with any types of peanut or peanut butter snacks.

- -Interdisciplinary Units include: Independence (Animals and Plants Adaptations), Rocks and Minerals, Simple Machines, and Moon and Stars.

 This program studies careers, the skills people need work in specific careers, and how businesses contribute to a city.

Language Arts:

- -Guided Reading (small group), whole class instruction, and Literature Circles will be methods used to teach reading this year. We will use a variety of texts to explore works of both fiction and non-fictions.
- -We will be using a Writing Workshop approach to teaching writing this year. The students will be writing various pieces of expository, narrative, persuasive, and creative writing. This includes planning, writing, editing, and publishing various works.

- -Some of the topics we will be covering will be Place Value, Multiplication (up to 12x), Addition and Subtracting 3 digits, Perimeter, Area, and elapsed time.
- -Children are encourages not only to solve problems, but also to share the thought process that leads to the solutions by showing their work.
- -Understanding the concepts behind basic facts and procedures is equally as important as mastering the basic facts.
- -We will be assessing students in their math journals, homework, quizzes, and unit assessment.
